Youth Ministry Culture: The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and State Farm Insurance released a study which reports that teenaged drivers are far more likely to drive dangerously when another teenager is in the car. In fact, teenage drivers are 6 times more likely to make illegal maneuvers when accompanied by another teenager. **Is your teen a safe driver?**

Questions to discuss with your family:

3. Oftentimes, if parents and teens can discuss reasonable boundaries on scenarios/activities/etc that are temptations, then failures can turn to successes. Spend some time discussing areas of temptations and develop some reasonable boundaries to help deter impurity.
